You should complete this form if you are planning work (i) which will take place on 2 hectares or more of *uncultivated land* or a *semi-natural area*; and (ii) which will increase the productivity for agriculture of that land. Please note that the 2 hectare "threshold" applies to the area of land, rather than how the work takes place – i.e. you will need permission for work involving more than 2 hectares of relevant land, even if it is undertaken bit-by-bit over a protracted time, or if it involves different types of work (e.g. ploughing in one area, use of fertiliser in another).
