We don't routinely carry out a Herd Census and so although our Online HerdBook states that we have 1268 animals in the Society, this will not now be an accurate figure as animals will have died or been culled or otherwise left the herd since the last check was carried out in 2013.

It would be helpful if members could notify Breed Admin when animals leave their herd (if you de-register a calf under one year old you are credited with half the registration fee) – it helps us keep the breed records up to date, picks up any animals that have been sold and animals that have died or been culled.

Please do make the effort to register a Pedigree Transfer of Ownership of an animal that you sell on and especially if the new owner is not a Society member, as they are a prospective new member and breeder. MIGHTY is a complete bull of 'mixed type' which means that he is suitable for use on all types of cows and for producing calves for meat and for producing heifer replacements. His figures from France indicate that 'he combines good skeletal measurements with marked muscle development in the upper and lower parts of the body. He is a bull with very fine limbs. Functional, MIGHTY has good depth and excellent morphology'. His dam, Vivie, in 10 calvings had an average calving interval of 378 days and there is easy calving on his sire's side.



"We use the Bazadais Angus cross rather than pure Bazadais to satisfy the Australian consumer preference for 6-8 mm of fat cover on red meat. Bazadais beef is just too lean when finished on grass here. Bazadais improve our Angus by increasing our yield (dressed weight/hot standard carcase weight) from 61% with Angus to 73+% with the cross, and the Bazadais influence also improves eating quality.

Our cattle are housed outside all year with a part supplementation of hay and grain during winter due to low digestibility and protein of our grass at that time of year. The farm has a slightly English-like climate being above the cloud line (1000 metre elevation) for about 3 months of the year – lots of mist! – with mild summer temperatures (25 - 30C) and coolish winters (down to -4C)."

We thank Anna Fearnley of the Carabeen Bazadais Stud, The Falls, Queensland for this insight into their operation.

This cattle property sits high in the Border Ranges of South East Queensland, Australia.

Anna writes "We have two businesses - a Bazadais stud and a 'Paddock to Plate' outlet selling our grass-fed Bazadais Angus beef to high-end restaurants and to the public."





"The stud has two distinct phenotype lines: one derived mainly from Ucla, Castro, and Izaute; the other from an imported French embryo by Talon and Theresa. All our sires are from France and the UK.

We have started performance recording in an Estimated Breeding Value program so we are generating comparative data on some of the French sires (for birthweight, 200-day weight, 400-day weight, 600-day weight, EMA, scrotal size, rump fat, intramuscular fat and retail beef yield). We assess our stud cattle using these data, genetic testing and breed attributes."

"See our website <u>www.carabeenbeef.com.au</u> and follow us on Facebook at Carabeen Beef. The farm's name "Carabeen" is from the Carabeen trees on our property. They are magnificent rainforest giants that live up to 1200 years."
