CABIN IN MOTION BUSINESS IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

OBJECTIVES 1.0

- Design and install a prefabricated cabin to be rented on a short-term basis through Airbnb. The cabin will be made to be easily moved after the end of the tenancy.
- We are after a small plot of farm/garden, 0.05-0.1 acres to locate the cabin for a long-term lease, 5-7 years.
- We offer high rental income for the land based on a profit-sharing system.
- The cabin is designed and fabricated to a high-quality, ensuring the design is in-keeping with the surrounding context.
- The cabin will be prefabricated off-site allowing for minimum disruption to your farm/garden, the structure will be designed to be slightly larger than a shepherds but

WHAT WE REQUIRE FROM YOU? 1.1

- We are looking to rent your land for a long-term lease, 5-7 years. Other than
 that, regarding; planning permission, off-site construction and letting we will
 take care of all of this, so you have nothing to worry about.
- Using Peter's experience in construction, the cabin will be prefabricated off-site allowing for minimum disruption.
- Road access and access to mains waters preferable.

WHAT PROFITS YOU SHOULD EXPECT? 1.2

- We understand a short-term rental business is an unconventional way to make money from your land, therefore in return we will compensate you with a higher income than what you could expect from traditional land leasing for such a small plot.
- We also believe the success of the cabin rental should be reflected in the profits; therefore, we will commit to profit sharing.
- We would expect the cabin to rent for, at least, 300 days a year rented at £130 a night. You should expect a 20% profit share of at least £7,800 per annum.

WHAT ELSE CAN YOU EXPECT? 1.3

Subject to the implementation of the cabin for 5-7 years, the land may as a
result benefit from the removal of a covenant to build a permanent dwelling
on the land. If the land is sold or built upon, we would expect 20% of the land
value.


